

Headteacher's Message

The theme of this week's anti-bullying week is 'Reach Out.' This can be linked with all our school values but particularly our value of positivity. In order to create a positive school community, we encourage all our pupils to 'reach out'. We work hard to build positive relationships between pupils and staff so that pupils can 'reach out' for support with any member of school staff or if they witness others needing help. On Monday, we explored this theme as a whole school and also introduced the mnemonic: STOP. This is a simplified definition of bullying and how to access help: Several Times on Purpose and Start Telling Other People. Please reinforce this with your child. Throughout this week, each class has explored an aspect of antibullying and also considered the steps required for safe conduct on-line.

On Remembrance Day, our KS2 school ambassadors visited St. George's Church to lay wreaths, on behalf of our school community. The children were fascinated to learn from Reverend Alison about some of the lives of the people from local farming communities who died in WW1 and WW2. I was so impressed with the respect and interest shown. We used the sadness evoked to talk about the responsibility of our younger generation to honour the dead by continuing to uphold our British values of: democracy, rule of law, respect, tolerance and liberty.

WEST SUSSEX ORCHESTRA PROGRAMME

Last year, the West Sussex Music Service set up the TOP (Tomorrow's Orchestra Programme) scheme for teaching children to learn to play an instrument from complete beginner to the point where they can perform. As it was such a success, it is being run again this year. It takes place over three terms.

Opportunities are available to learn a stringed, brass or woodwind instrument at one of three Music Centres (Chichester, Horsham, or Worthing). The classes are extremely competitively priced, with the first term being free, and the loan of an instrument included. The next classes begin in January.


Thought for the Week
