#### **SURVEYS**

This term, a range of surveys have taken place to help shape our next academic year. It was wonderful to read so many positives about multiple aspects of school life. Thank you to everyone, who took the time to share. The developmental comments are also helpful at building a shared understanding of priorities, although budgetary constraints are also a significant factor in decision making. Some of the areas raised by parents such as our approach to homework will feature on next year's school improvement plan. Once shared with staff and governors, this will be uploaded to our website.

Discussions with staff have also taken place. One of their areas of concern centres on personal belongings. Due to Covid, parents were asked to provide stationery for their individual child. As Covid is hopefully behind us, we are returning to providing all stationery that is required. This will help reduce disputes. Therefore, from September, we ask that children refrain from bringing pencil cases to school. If you would like to contribute anything to our shared stationery supply, then glue sticks and coloured pencils are always useful. Thank you.

Our uniform policy states that children in KS1 each require a bookbag rather than a rucksack. It makes it much easier for teachers changing books if every child has a bookbag. Therefore, rucksacks are not required in KS1. Even in KS2 space in cloakrooms is really limited. As the children get older, it is lovely for them to move to the privilege of having a rucksack in KS2 but we would appreciate if this could be as small as possible.

Earlier in the week the reasons of all of this was shared with the children. Our school uniform policy has also been shared: https://jolesfield-school.co.uk/key-information/uniform/

As shared previously, please name your child's belongings. From September, where possible, we will write in pen children's names in jumpers and cardigans but this is not as effective as a sewn-in or ironed on label. Only named belongings can be put in lost property as these can be immediately returned to their owner. Unnamed belongings are disposed of weekly. Again the reasons for this was discussed with the children.

A few parents have enquired about grey pinafore dresses. These are not currently on our uniform policy but including these will be considered at our first full governing body meeting in September.


#### Thought for the Week


