## Online safety: top tips

Going online is a huge part of most young people's lives so it's a important to talk to them about online safety. Here's our tips to get you started.

## Chat to them about what they like to do online

The best way to find out what your third is doing online is to tails to them and have regular conversations so that online safety is part of everyday discession. Ask them open-ended questions like "What's your favourite game or app to play on?".

Listen to what they have to say and

## show an interest.

They could give you a demo of their favourite app or show you their favourite YouTube or TikTok account.

 They will probably be able to teach you things you

don't know! This will also give you an opportunity to chat about any safety settings they might already have in place.

Regular conversations with your child

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## Talk about who they are in contact with online

There are late of different ways that children can talk to people online – messaging apps, or social media, and less obvious ways such as chat on online games. Talk to your child about who they are talking to and what they are sharing with them.

 Use settings to help limit who can conta your shift.

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- Remind your child that they shouldn't sl personal information with people they don't know intine
- Let your child know they can come to your another trusted adult if any conservation makes them feet uncomfortable.

Help manage what they see and do online in high and explain to them. Parental contrast and privacy settings can help you manage in the sets.

- Device settings manage things like location sharing, screen time and in-app purchase and gaming companies have dedicated pages to support with setting these up.
- App or game settings in-app tools that can help to keep your child's account private a taking to. You can remaily find information on these in account sattings or directly on the platforms website.
- Mobile or network provider settings help to manage browsing access and stop your ci represents thes or downloading apps that aren't suitable. Contact your mobile or broadband provider for more information about setting this sp.

## Remember it's ok to ask for help!

Remember you don't have to be an online safety expert - that's our job! We're here to help, with resources and advice to help support you and your child.

If your child asks you a question you don't know the answer to, or speaks to you almost a negative expensions they fad online, here are some of things you could do:
