# Headteacher's Message

Welcome back to the second-half of the Autumn term; I hope you and your family had a pleasant half-term. As you are aware, we started the half-term with an INSET day; we are often asked about how these are used in school.

INSET stands for In-Service Education and Training and are statutory in all state maintained schools. The Headteacher of each school plans when these will take place and how they will be used. On Monday, our focus was on curriculum design. Using the research of an Educational Specialist, Emma Turner, we focussed on our curriculum offer and the opportunities it provides for children to accumulate knowledge and skills as they progress through the school. This included identifying areas of understanding which are fundamental to progression, such as chronology in History and considering how to embed these concepts without losing subject breadth. We also looked closely at areas of our curriculum which can be interconnected in a meaningful way. With this in mind, there have been some minor revisions to the Autumn term curriculum overview so these have been re-shared today.

# **Curriculum Spotlight**



Just before half-term, our Year 6 children visited the PGL centre, Windmill Hill in Hailsham for 5 days. They were supported by Mr Brookes, Mrs Eyre and myself. This was an opportunity to meet the National Curriculum PE requirement: 'Children should be taught to take part in outdoor and adventurous activity challenges both individually and within a team.' It was wonderful to see our year 6 children embrace and respond to the range of challenges offered. Children participated in numerous activities such as raft building, canoeing, abseiling and climbing. The remit of the PE curriculum was fully met in even just one day of participation! However, a residential is about so much more than National Curriculum requirements. It is about trying new foods, learning new games, packing independently, supporting each other, emotional resilience, new experiences, problem solving and building bonds through shared memories. I was very proud of the positive attitude and conduct of all our children. Thank you very much to the staff, who volunteered to take part in the residential, and to the wonderful parents, who drove their child and other children.





# NEW! West Sussesx Mind Parenting Peer Support Group 'Circles' near you!

If you are you a parent or care giver to a child or young person and supporting them with their mental health, you may feel alone at times and need some support. Did you know peer support can help increase confidence and can help you learn new skills like coping with challenges? We have started Peer Support Group 'Circles' across the county, where you can meet the team and other parents, all with lived experience.

# The Parents Service at West Sussex Mind has lots more to offer:

We hold regular Peer Support Groups both during the day (both in person and on-line) and evening (on-line). We have a monthly 'Expert by Experience' Guest Speaker join us for one of the evening sessions, this year so far we have covered topics such as Self-harm, OCD, Social Anxiety and How to manage aggressive behaviours. These sessions are great as you get to hear more about the subject and a chance to ask any questions relating to your situation.

Another great aspect of the service is the opportunity to have some 1:1 sessions with a Peer Support Worker (again who has lived and professional experience).

These are in blocks of three and can be delivered at a time convenient for you.

We have a closed Facebook group for sharing information and to give parents and carers a platform to ask any questions confidentially.

There are monthly newsletters and access to training, e-learning and webinars (on the West Sussex Mind website).
