It seems unbelievable to be writing the last newsletter of this academic year! Academic years pass so quickly but the change we see in the children is incredible. Our Reception children have made huge strides in all aspects of their development. They are also so excited about their own learning journey with a passion and energy that we hope never dims. Whilst it is always wonderful to see children making progress academically, there is so much more to celebrate. We have seen children learn to swim, make new friends, try a musical instrument, learn to whittle, light a fire with a flint, visit an opera house, perform a solo, take part in a new sport, climb using a harness, overcome fears, develop independent strategies and have the courage to ask for help. The year has been full of huge personal achievements and we celebrate each and everyone of these.

Our Year 6 production 'Gigglebox' was a joy to behold. There was superb acting, brave solos, wonderful synchronised dancing, incredible comedic timing, well-delivered lines and great singing. TEAM UPDATES

Jo Wilbourn, one of our capable, dedicated and long-serving teaching assistants will not be part of our September staff team. I am sure that you will join me in thanking her for her long service and wishing her all the best for her future.

Oscar Pettit, who many of you will be familiar with, as a staff member of the Brighton and Hove Football Club Association is joining our staff team! Oscar has been a valuable part of the Jolesfield community for 3 years, leading our Football Club and teaching some classes as a part of our PPA provision. Oscar has a huge heart for every child and for a long time has been passionate about becoming a primary school teacher. Therefore, we are delighted to have been able to offer Oscar a Teacher Apprenticeship. Oscar will be primarily teaching within Year 3. If your child has attended the Football Club and known Oscar as Oscar, please help them practise using the more formal address of Mr Pettit! Oscar will also be running a Girls' Football Club in the Autumn term on a Wednesday.

By law, all teachers are allocated time for Preparation, Planning and Assessment (PPA), we cover this in a variety of ways, sometimes using other teachers, teaching assistants and specialist providers. From September, BHAFC are making some changes that prompted us to review their offer. On the basis of this we are moving to a new provider called Kick, whose vision and ethos is fully aligned to ours. This will allow us to keep the element of specialist sports coaching, which enriches our PPA offer. In addition, Kick will also lead one after-school sports club a term.

SWIMMING

During the hot weather, our swimming pool has been such an incredible resource. We have seen children start a block of swimming lessons unable to swim and conclude the sessions being able to swim on both their front and back! Thank you so much for all the donations that have helped us run swimming for another year. In addition, sponsors linked to our sponsored swim have poured in with incredible generosity. Thank you! We are having the filter media changed at the beginning of the holidays but also getting a quote for a new pool cover. The money raised through the sponsored swim will help towards this.

Every class has received between 10 and 12 swimming sessions. As you know, there are very strong hygiene standards that have to be met in order to permit the pool to be used. Our pool controller, Peter, has done a brilliant job at meeting these which is very challenging in such sunny weather as the chlorine burns away so quickly. Peter's testing is complemented by South East Water, who regularly take samples to analyse in the laboratory. A test result received yesterday has shown the presence of a bacteria emerging in the pipe work, which requires a significant amount of chlorine to be added. This has resulted in the pool being closed this morning. However, the South East Water results received this afternoon have come back clear, so we are pleased that the pool is able to remain open for the remainder of this term, and swimming lessons are able to resume tomorrow.

YEAR 6 LEAVERS

Thank you so much to all the parents, who joined our Year 6 pupils at the Diocesan Leavers' service. This took place in the beautiful location of Christ's Hospital and was attended by multiple schools. Our children sang beautifully and some gave a reading. Bishop Ruth gave an encouraging talk and reminded the children of how loved they are in the eyes of God.

TAX-FREE CHILDCARE

Tax-Free Childcare (TFC) is a childcare top-up for working parents. It can be used to help pay for breakfast clubs, after school clubs, holiday clubs, childminders, or sports activities. This is available for children aged up to 11, or 17 if the child has a disability. 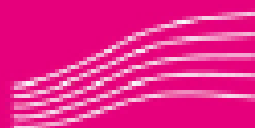

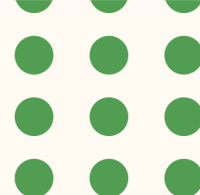

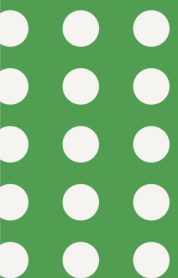
